PLEASE READ Psalm 16 from your own Bible, then Today's Gospel Reading: John 20: 19-31......

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.' But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.' A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'

Time to Reflect - What does resurrection mean?

Into those shut doors and fearful hearts Jesus comes bringing resurrection and peace. This resurrection doesn't turn back the clock, or erase the horror of Good Friday. The marks and scars are still there. Without those marks, the pierced hands and side, the resurrection could not be real, and our life would not be real without many scars and hurts.

A week later the disciples with Thomas are together again. Jesus meets them there again. We are not expected to make a leap of faith and travel towards it, but it comes and meets us, and then we needs to be open to experience an inner encounter, a calm inner knowing and then faith to believe.

The resurrection comes to empower and change us, and will lead us to what Jesus promised - abundant life in all its fullness, not as the world perceives it, but in the upside down Jesus way where everyone is blessed through it.

But let's also notice that the doors aren't just closed on the first encounter, but the following week. It isn't just Thomas who is doubting, the disciples are still locked in. The meetings with the risen Christ haven't culminated in throwing open of doors and shouting praises and preaching sermons. It seems there is a build-up, a gradual realization, a growing confidence in the resurrected Christ. This resurrection hope is ours too, Christ, now, in all, with all, for all.

Take a time to sit quietly, and then.....

A time of prayer

Into the closed doors of this world come, Lord, and speak your word of peace and life

We pray for all those who are ill and for those who yearn for their health.

We pray for those who are homeless and for those who struggle to feed themselves and their families.
