Then Jesus said, "God's kingdom is like seed thrown on a field by a man who then goes to bed and forgets about it. The seed sprouts and grows—he has no idea how it happens. REFLECTION

The trees and plants in our garden have changed from being barren brown to a beautiful green, some full of promising blossoms to give us hope of provision for the autumn. I can never help but marvel at the wonder of nature.

Lots of people have found this last week the most difficult so far, life feels barren for many - bleak and lifeless. We are so grateful of the support and encourage each to the other, yet that doesn't always seem to help.

The reading from Mark speaks of God being at work in all sorts of ways yet without us doing a single thing, and it also promises that we will still reap a harvest. In ways which only God knows, The Ultimate Divine Creative Energy is working through every day, conversation, sadness, and joy, through every change and challenge, and I believe we will eventually see a harvest, which maybe not be one we are expecting. This harvest won't be one we've played much of a part in, but it will be a harvest which will show to us that God has been and still is at work. A harvest which will gives us a clear message that from death (dark

days, sadness, confusion, struggle, loss) comes resurrection (new life, joy, clarity, hope, consolation, faith).

The Isley Brothers wrote a song called "Harvest for the world". The chorus says

"Gather everyman, gather every woman, celebrate your lives, gives thanks for your children. Gather everyone, gather all together, overlooking none, hoping life gets better for the world."

Let's see ourselves as a God's 'children of the world', for we are all in this together, half of the world's population are locked down, all are affected. Let's pray that the harvest of love, compassion, unity and peace will come, not just to the few, but to everyone.
