Acts 1: 6-14 The Ascension of Jesus

So when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up towards heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up towards heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.'

Time to Reflect

They hadn't really had a chance to think about it. Surely it's the most human thing in the world to keep watching the space where someone was, to need some time to adjust to a huge change in the features of your everyday life?

There has started to be talk in the media about a "new normal". Many of us had already beginning to realise that things will not quickly or immediately go back to exactly how they were. Our lives are going to look different for a significant period of time, or for some of us forever if we, like the disciples, have lost people who made up a big part of our lives.

Jesus' disciples have a promise, of the Holy Spirit to help them in this 'new normal', but they don't know when the Spirit will come. Meanwhile they witnessed Jesus going away from them. What did they understand about what we call the Ascension? It says they looked up, towards heaven, what did they think about 'heaven'.

It should help us, if we think of 'heaven' as the presence of God - Heaven is where God is. Of course God is present everywhere in what we call the world, but God is often unrecognised, denied, opposed and even hated. When I pray the line of the Lord's prayer - "thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven" - I think of the areas of the world where God's Kingdom is witnessed and His will is done as heavenly places (and every part of the world have these through people who love through His Spirit) and as I pray I ask that this wonderful heavenly love will flood all parts of God's earth so that one day heaven will reign on earth.

So let's not think of heaven as somewhere far off, or something that is going to come to us - or we to it - in some mysterious time in the future. Wherever there is a remorseful thought, an act of love, a kind unselfish word or action, however simple, there is the Spirit, there is heaven. We thank God therefore that on this earth we have a foretaste of the Eternal Heavenly Kingdom, waiting for us when this life, in this body, is finished.
