Readings

Luke 10 vs 38-42 As Jesus and his disciples were on their way, he came to a village where a woman named Martha opened her home to him. She had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet listening to what he said. But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work? Tell her to help me!" "Martha, Martha," the Lord said "you are worried and upset about many things, but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."

John 15 vs 5 "I am the true vine" I am the vine are you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit, apart from me you can do nothing. <u>1 Corinthians 12 vs 27</u> -

"You are the body of Christ"

<u>Reflection</u> This lockdown time is bringing different responses from people - some are enjoying space and quiet, others' lives have changed very little, and some are finding it very difficult. Families are facing particularly stressful and tense circumstances at homes - yet with nowhere to run to.

We often speak of the church as "the body of Christ". When Paul used this term in his letter it was because he was dealing with people falling out with each other, and forgetting what held them together. He told them that it is Christ who joins you.

Yet **"The body"** is only one way of describing the Church. Jesus, in the reading from John's Gospel, doesn't calls us a Body but branches of **"a Vine"**. This brings a whole different series of ideas.

As **a body**, different parts do different things, each has its own job.

As a Vine, all the parts are doing the same things. A body is expected to 'do',

A Vine is expected to 'be' and to 'grow'.

'Bodies' go to places witnessing in word & deed. **'Vines'** just are.

When we reflect on the story of Mary and Martha, we could almost say that **bodies** are like Martha very often busy doing this and that, and **Vines** are like Mary, just being, listening,

contemplating and learning.

Anyone who knows me will have realised that my nature tends towards the Martha. In Ministry alongside you, I enjoy doing, helping, talking, organising, supporting etc.

Although the Virus restrictions seems to have taken away so much for some, I have to say that during this time I've have found the joy of being a 'Mary'. There is now **time**, for unrushed prayer, to reflect at the end of the day, to listen to worship songs, to walk slowly then stop look and reflect, to appreciate all we have & those whose lives we share, to prepare for Sundays.

At this time we are all doing the same thing. All called together for this season to be branches on 'a vine'. We need to give ourselves time just 'to be', with time 'to grow' in Christ. Vines do bear fruit in season, and I really believe that we all have potential to bear fruit by sow seeds of love, and we will one day see the harvest of those seeds.

A PRAYER - Thank you Jesus for your words teaching us that the way of Mary can be the better way. Give us patience, trust and hope. AMEN

We then pause as Jesus places the bread in the hands of our brothers and sisters...... We raise our hands to our mouth and breathe in the gift of love Jesus is giving - we are part of the broken, worshipping, praying, body of Christ.....

We watch now as Jesus raises **the cup of wine**..... Jesus stands in front of us, and offers this to us..... We imagine taking the cup and holding it in our hands and we breathe in the words Jesus says....

"you are a child of God, forgiven & free, yet part of the suffering world. The gift of heaven on earth, & heaven beyond earth, is yours."

We breathe in the wonderful gifts of God.... Thank you God of Heaven and earth. Amen
