REFLECTION

This song was written by Robin Mark and this is the story of how it came about. In 1994 Robin was watching an end of year TV review, it had been the year of Rwandan Civil war which claimed the lives of one million people. I remember this year well as many of you will. Robin despaired about the state of the world and began to ask God if He were really in control and what sort of days these were.

He says "I felt in my spirit that God replied to my prayer by saying that, indeed, He was very much in control and that the days we were living in were special times - they were Elijah days. Days where we need to be holy and just people like Moses. Right living is important in all our attitudes and doings. Robin went to church the next Sunday where the pastor spoke of the valley of dry bones and the Spirit breathing new life. He wrote this song in the church kitchen, between the first and second services of the morning. At the end of the morning worship he presented it to the worship band and they performed it that very day.

This is a time of 'great trial' for many. Some have been locked down & locked in for about 13 weeks. We feel the separation from our loved ones. Some long to be independent and not have to rely on the kindness of others, and others realise they will be dependent on others for some time yet. We have days when we feel like crying out, when we feel sorry for ourselves - and we are allowed that. Elijah, Ezekiel, Moses, King David were no different from us, but what we see in the pattern of scripture is that positive breeds positive, optimism crushes pessimism, encouragement creates new life, a timely good word builds up, a light hearted spirit lifts the spirit of another. It doesn't mean we will 'feel' like this all of the time, but if with God's help we can communicate it when we speak to others on the phone, when we write, when we meet, then we are becoming part of the Kingdom work which Jesus illustrates. I'm sure Jesus had his down times, but it seems to me that when this happened He took himself off to pray. We are not perfect, we get it wrong, there are days when we can't help but feel fed up, but keep firing those arrow prayers to God, He's always listening, and always here to help with even our smallest needs. The fruits of the Spirit are

> Love, joy, peace, patience Kindness, goodness, faithfulness, Gentleness & self-control

We've got them all stored in us, sometimes we just need help opening the box. Let God be the Lord of every part of your life.
