## **GOD'S WORD - selected verses from Genesis 8**

But God remembered Noah and all the wild animals and the livestock that were with him in the ark...

After forty days Noah opened a window he had made in the ark and sent out a raven, and it kept flying back and forth until the water had dried up from the earth. Then he sent out a dove to see if the water had receded from the surface of the ground. But the dove could find nowhere to perch because there was water over all the surface of the earth; so it returned to Noah in the ark.

He waited seven more days and again sent out the dove from the ark. When the dove returned to him in the evening, there in its beak was a freshly plucked olive leaf! Then Noah knew that the water had receded from the earth. He waited seven more

days and sent the dove out again, but this time it did not return to him.

By the twenty-seventh day of the second month the earth was completely dry. Then God said to Noah, "Come out of the ark"

So Noah came out and built an altar to the LORD He sacrificed burnt offerings on it. The LORD smelled the pleasing aroma and said in his heart: "Never again will I curse the ground because of humans, even though every inclination of the human heart is evil from childhood. And never again will I destroy all living creatures, as I have done.

In this story, Noah and his family were in isolation for 370 days but unlike us, with them were all the smells of a floating zoo, and when Noah came out, he entered a whole new world.

# <u>So how did Noah know when it was safe to enter this new reality?</u>

He had the report of the raven, the reports of the dove but still didn't leave the ark till he had the report of the Lord.

I wondered if perhaps this is a picture of what we need to consider at this time, to determine when it will be safe to enter the new world that awaits us on the other side of the pandemic.

Some around us are desperate to get back to 'normality', to gather together as people called 'church' in the buildings, to travel & spend time with family and friends. Noah's tests and data collection came from 2 birds. We are listening daily to news, data, guidelines, scientific reports.

Ravens are scavengers who will settle for anything and pinch food and resources from anywhere they can, even in hostile surroundings.

Doves are wise, sensitive, strategic, and won't settle for anything, or put themselves in danger.

When the raven didn't return Noah could have relied on just that, and thought it was ok to get out the ark. But he then sent out the dove and waited for confirmation that the time was right.

I think we need the spirit of the dove, not the raven. Let's not scavenge for a sense of normality but wait with wisdom to protect ourselves and others, making sure things are safe & secure.

But Noah didn't just act after he had data from the birds, he waited for God to say come out.

And what did Noah do first – built an altar and worshipped God. We hope that worshipping God together is one of the first things we do, whenever that is. God deserves our worship, praise, adoration for faithfulness through this.

Noah then built a vineyard. There was fruitfulness after the flood. We know God continues to be faithful during this time. Sale of Bibles is up by 55%, people turn to prayer, 25% of the population are watching church service on-line. God is moving in hearts of people, so, we need to be ready to meet others on the other side of the pandemic. Let's pray for fruitfulness when we are able to meet in some form in the future.

As Noah entered a different world, we need to be ready perhaps for a different way of being Church. Maybe not so reliant on buildings, but reliant on people who love the Lord, perhaps building on the relationships made in this time of isolation. Praying for those who have reached out to God during this time and making ourselves ready to be available to them in some way in the different world around us.

God goes before us. God will see us through to the other side, we must be faithful to His calling.
