Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved. I urge Euodia and I urge Syntyche to be of the same mind in the Lord. Yes, and I ask you also, my loyal companion, help these women, for they have struggled beside me in the work of the gospel, together with Clement and the rest of my co-workers, whose names are in the book of life.

Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

Time to Reflect The reading from Philippians reminds me of a chorus that was often sung as a 'round' – "Rejoice in the Lord always and again I say rejoice" However, we may ask "how can we rejoice in the Lord **always**?" Life is not always a bed of roses and we often face hardship and struggles. The Covid-19 crisis has been really challenging for many people and it may seem that rejoicing is last thing on our minds.

But what is it that makes us rejoice? Most people will have different answers and some will mention material things, presents, money, going to the gym, hairdressers or going on holiday; therefore the lack of these has been a real bind for some.

All through the Bible, we are reminded that there is more to life than material blessings. Cynics may say "fine talk when you live in the affluent West". Nikki, Kim and I had planned to be in Kampala this month with Chrysalis Uganda. During my last visit (2 years ago) I found that those who had little in material terms were still able to rejoice, they valued family and community, were thankful for the little they had, and were delighted to share what they had with us.

Covid-19 has challenged us all and made us think about what is really important in life. It has brought many closer to family and friends, reminded us to be thankful, given us time to look for blessings that are beyond the material world and which we would not normally notice. Paul says that when we come before the Lord with joy and thanksgiving we shall find His peace. There will be many today who do not have joy or peace in their lives, and who strive to find it in the 'worldly'. My prayer is that one day, all will find the peace and joy, not through what we have or the circumstances of our lives, but through God's dynamic, comforting, reassuring, enduring energy living in and around us.
