**OUR BIBLE READING**

**Philippians 2:3-4 "Do nothing from selfish  
ambition or conceit, but in humility count  
others more significant than  
yourselves. Let each of you look not only  
to his own interests, but also to the interests  
of others."**

**REFLECTION** - On Sunday afternoon I spoke to my dear school friend Sara. We are Sisters in Christ together, a special relationship. Sara recalled their Christians Together service at the Parish Church that morning, also saying how blessed they were to have such lovely people in their village. She spoke of how Revd Neil Richardson, a previous President of the Methodist Conference, played the piano for the service. My heart warmed, why you may ask, because Neil is a wonderful preacher and teacher and would have led the service beautifully, but was equally content to play the piano and let another lead. Just because we are very skilled and capable in leading, preaching, teaching, managing, singing, organising, baking, crafting etc. it doesn't mean we always have to be the ones to do these things.

"do nothing out of selfish ambition, or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves". Phil 2:3

Day to day this may be about letting others go first, meeting a persons' need before our own, stepping back to let others step up, and also stepping up as others step back for us. You see we never fully know someone, especially if they are new to us. We have no idea what they are good at, find difficult, or are really bad at; we won't know all their struggles or talents; whether they are lacking in confidence, shy, or just cautious, Sometimes by stepping back and encouraging others to go forward we find hidden depths and talents which can be nurtured and used for the glory of God.

This is exactly what our Lord did. The greatest way Jesus taught humility was

when he knelt to wash the disciple's feet. Jesus was the humble, servant King. His ministry was often about stepping back then inspiring and encouraging others to step forward - to think for themselves, answer their own questions, catch fish, heal, provide bread and fish, walk on water, not through their power but by His. Jesus could have done it all himself, yet in humility he allowed them to, so they would grow in confidence and trust. Jesus asks us to do the same now.
