## Jesus is tempted - Matthew chapter 4

The Jesus, led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. After fasting for 40 days and 40 nights Jesus was hungry. The tempter came to him and said "if you are the son of God tell these stones to become bread". Jesus answered "it is written that man shall not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God". Then the devil took him to the holy city and set him on the highest point of the temple. "If you are the son of God" he said "throw yourself down for it is written He will command his angels concerning you and they will lift you up in their hands so that you will not strike your foot against a stone". Jesus answered him, "it is also written do not put the Lord your God to the test".

Again the devil took Jesus to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendour. "All this I will give you", he said, "if you will bow down and worship me". Jesus answered "away from me satan, for it is written worship the Lord your God and serve him only" Then the devil left him and angels came and attended him.



# REFLECTION

There has been an advert on TV encouraging us not to ignore or belittle health signs by saying "it's just a rash, it's just a mark" but to take them seriously. We often use the word 'just' in sentences, starting them by saying "I'm just....she's just..... that's just..... it's just..... by using it we're tempted to belittle ourselves as children of God, therefore forgetting what mighty power God is, and how God can do more than we ever ask or imagine. The story below illustrates this brilliantly

Christina Tsai (1890 - 1984) was converted to Christ in a missionary school in China. In 1930 when she was 40 she was stricken with malaria, which left her extremely debilitated. Christina became so sensitive to light and noise that she remained confined to a dark room from 1931 until she died in 1984.

But amazingly her ministry grew despite her weakness with many people visiting her bedside and finding Christ. She used her bed as a pulpit, and led countless people to accept Christ. Drawn by the Holy Spirit's prompting people travelled from all parts of the world to visit her, she seldom refused to see anyone no matter how she felt.

All of us long for good health, we worry about sickness, and being 'locked in'. Our concern here is totally normal and natural, but it is when we are tempted to give up and adopt the frame of mind which tells us "I'm just useless, I'm just hopefless" that the danger lies.

Jesus was tempted in the desert and yet each time His response was based on what God could do and not what the human Jesus could do. We can be spiritually strong in Christ even though we are physically weak, and restricted. I'm sure Christina Tsai was tempted at times to say "I'm just stuck in bed, I just can't do anything", but she is quoted as saying

"Clouds may gather over our homes in times of trouble, but the influence of a Christian character shines through the clouds with a golden radiance, bringing a lasting blessing".
