We follow on from last weeks' Gospel passage and read:-

John 20: vs 24-29 Jesus and Thomas

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.'

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'



A REFLECTION

Poor Thomas, famously known as 'doubting Thomas' from the passage in John's gospel. The name hasn't left him. Yet remembering the events leading up to the crucifixion, Peter denied Jesus and all the disciples deserted him, none were true to their word. The disciples have already seen Jesus, but Thomas was missing. I feel sorry for him, this life-changing event and he missed it, not only that but he questioned whether it had actually happened.

Doubt is a very human emotion, we all experience it at times. Doubt our abilities, doubt when God is asking us to do something, doubt what others tell us. Yet isn't this doubt a positive thing. I have always doubted my own abilities, therefore when I was at college I was always the first to ask for help, or for clarity about something I didn't understand - often to the relief of others who didn't want to ask for fear of being made foolish - I still do the same now.

Doubt need not always be seen as a negative emotion, it leads to questions, and ultimately to answers to those questions. Thomas doubted that the other disciples had seen Jesus, but when he finally saw Jesus, he didn't need to touch Jesus to know, he called him "My Lord and my God", he recognised who Jesus really was – God.

Jesus told the disciples that those who believe without seeing are blessed. For some of us it might not take very long to believe, while for others it takes years of questioning before getting answers. When we reach the point of belief we can and will, with assurance, recognise and call Jesus "My Lord and my God". Take a time to sit quietly for a while.....
