It was a role that would arouse suspicion, court shame, disrupt her forthcoming marriage, lead her into danger and, ultimately, if briefly, break her heart. But what an honour! As we agree to do whatever God asks of us, we walk in the footsteps of this remarkable lady.

## <u>NOW, FROM ONE OF TODAY'S</u> LECTIONARY READINGS:

"But you know that (Jesus) appeared so that He might take away our sins." (1 John 3 v 5a, NIV) Let us now clear the air with God by confessing our sins: admitting our wrongdoings and recognising our bad attitudes. If we do this honestly, we have full assurance that He will forgive us, and fill us afresh with His Spirit: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1 v 9, NIV)

<u>1 John chapter 3 vs 1-7</u> See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been

made known. But we know that when Christ appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. All who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure. Everyone who sins breaks the law; in fact, sin is lawlessness. But you know that he appears so that he might take away our sins. And in him is no sin. No one who lives in him keeps on sinning. No one who continues to sin has either seen him or known him. Dear children, do not let anyone lead you astray. Look at what v 1 says - speak it out and receive it as the truth: "See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are!"



For some, these words are truly wonderful. But there may be those who, for various reasons, find it difficult to call God Father. Jesus totally understands this. Yet the complete, unequalled love of God, is beyond any human love, beyond anything we can fully imagine or realise, and is here for each one of you to hold your hands out and receive. <u>Let us spend a few minutes in silence,</u> <u>listening for God's still, small voice</u> <u>assuring us that we are loved beyond</u>
