John 20 vs 19-21. On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you" After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord. Again Jesus said "Peace be with you!"

On the 3<sup>rd</sup> day Jesus rose from the dead. On that same evening, He stood in the room where the frightened disciples were huddled together. Jesus first words were not to shame them for forgetting His promise, or to rebuke for running away, but "Shalom" - bringing the

struggling and human disciples words of comfort and reassurance. And something else - he showed them the scars in his hands and on his side. Powerful proof of identity,

and they were filled with joy. Jesus then repeats - "peace be with you" and then 'sends' them, empowered by the Holy Spirit. They took on the challenge and turned the world upside down. The church arew up from the belief in the Resurrection of

Jesus on this first Easter Sunday, and it changed unreliable followers into fearless evangelists (you can read about them in

Acts). Nothing but a certainty in the forever presence of Jesus can explain this total immediate change in these ordinary folk. Today is a special day to celebrate and remind ourselves that Jesus resurrection will have a similar effect on our lives. Peace amid turmoil, fears eased, anxieties calmed, focus from worry, and comfort beyond words, as we worship of One who conquered death by rising from the grave and is alive and active in the world for ever more.

#### Remembering Jesus presence we sing or say

Here is bread, here is wine Christ is with us, He is with us Break the bread, drink the wine, Christ is with us here.

## <u>We now spend time visualising Jesus</u> presence, offering us bread and wine, in HOLY COMMUNION together..



Lord Jesus, we pause to be still, to breathe slowly, and to acknowledge your presence.

We are physically present here Lord, heart, body, mind, soul. This Communion together with You is corporate and universal......

We see in our minds Jesus standing before us. He looks at us and says..... "I came for the sick, for the hurting and hungry, and I am here for you. The bread and wine I offer are not a prize or reward, they are food for your journey and medicine for your soul."

We hold out our empty hands and imagine Jesus placing a piece of bread on them...... We pause as Jesus offers bread to others..... We bring our hands to our mouths and breathe in the gift of Christ's presence, meeting our brokenness with His brokenness.

Again Jesus looks at us and this time He says **"Come, take and drink the wine, the only condition is that you are present with me"** We visualise Jesus placing the wine in our hands, and in the hands of others. We lift our hands to our mouth, breathing in His gift, and uniting ourselves with the suffering of the world.

Thank you Jesus Christ for your real presence, forgiveness, love, mercy, Grace. We will keep taking, eating and drinking this mystery, until one day it dawns on us "I really am what I eat ..... I also am the body of Christ" **AMEN**   We pray in your love for the Church throughout the world, and those who minister to others in so many ways.
